Multi-society competition

Having societies and sports teams compete in a big competition can be a great way to raise money on campus!

Getting ready

Step 1 – Decide what type of competition you want to do. Games or sports tournaments always work well!

Step 2 – Choose members of your team to help organise the event – some may already be active in societies so be sure to make use of those networks.

Step 3 – Set up the event page, choose a date and secure any resources/permissions you need for the day to ensure everything runs smoothly.

Step 4 – Get as many societies as possible involved. Make sure you have a desirable prize for the winning team, and charge a 'suggested donation' per team or individual for entry. Utilize your participants' knowledge and friends across university to get as many people involved as possible

Top tip

 Think about ways you can upgrade the event - you could sell food and drinks, do a BBQ or run a raffle for extra donations.

What you'll need

- Location and permissions
- Any relevant resources (e.g. footballs, stopwatches, megaphone etc.)
- Prizes
- Society contact details (usually via the SU website or social media)
- First aid kit (just in case)
- A camera to take lots of photos

On the day

- Arrive early with your team and delegate responsibilities.
- Prepare the venue for the competition with the prizes on show.
- Ensure each team has a way to distinguish itself and that everyone knows what is happening, when and who is taking part. You may need to MC for the day to do announcements!

Post event

- If you are collecting donations on the day, count and bank them as soon as possible. Send them to MRF immediately to avoid possible complications.
- Make sure you congratulate the participants and tell your team how much they can add to their fundraising pages.
- Post all the photos on social media and thank everyone for taking part!
