Rotary Club Guide



Asking your local rotary club for sponsorship can bring in very sizeable donations, and can be as easy as simply sending them a letter!

What you'll need

- A list of local rotary clubs in your area
- Your letter of authority (if you don't have this, please speak to your contact at the charity)
- MRF template letter (see page 2 of this document)

Who to contact

- Find out who your local rotary club(s) are by searching the name of your hometown and 'rotary club' online.
- Some rotary clubs have an online application form that they may ask you to complete, or it may be as simple as sending them a copy of your letter of authority with an accompanying letter.
- Be aware they may ask you to deliver a
 presentation explaining why they should
 choose to support your cause. If you would
 any help with this, get in touch with your
 charity contact and they can share our premade awareness presentations.
